

**MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL CALLED MEETING OF THE MAYOR  
AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF BOONEVILLE  
SEPTEMBER 9, 2014**

BE IT REMEMBERED that the special called meeting of the Mayor and Board of Alderman of the City of Booneville, Mississippi, was held on Tuesday, September 9, 2014, at the Booneville City Hall at 6:00 p.m., the time and place noticed for said meeting. Those in attendance were Mayor Derrick Blythe and the following members of the Board: Alderman David Bolen, Alderman Harold Eaton, Alderman Mark McCoy, Alderman Jason Michael and Alderman Jeff Williams. Also, present were Lavaile Shields, City Clerk, and Daniel K. Tucker, City Attorney. The meeting was called to order in open session by Mayor Blythe and a quorum was declared present.

There first came on for consideration, the request by the Baptist Student Union to be allowed to use one of the softball fields, after the Northeast Football game on Thursday night, and that the park be kept open until around 11:30 p.m., to allow the students to use the field. Alderman Michael made said motion, seconded by Alderman Williams, and with the Aldermen present and voting "Aye", the motion unanimously carried.

There next came on for consideration, the request to grant the exception on the Johnny Coombs Property. Mr. Coombs had purchased a mobile home, which he had sold to an individual. The mobile home had not been in use for over six (6) months, therefore was nonconforming with the current policy. Alderman Eaton made a motion to grant the exception to hook up power and water, seconded by Alderman Williams, and the following vote was had:

With three (3) for and two (2) against, the motion carried.

There next came on for consideration, the request to send Ashley Hurt to the Court Clerk seminar on September 10 through September 12, including meals, mileage, and lodging in Jackson, Mississippi, for the approximate amount of \$369.40. Alderman Williams made said motion, seconded by Alderman Michael, and with the Aldermen present and voting

“Aye”, the motion unanimously carried.


